DEER VALLEY MEN'S CLUB

INTRODUCTION

These rules and policies should be read with care by newcomers and present members alike. Changes are made from time to time to previous editions of the ANNUAL HANDBOOK.

The purpose of the Deer Valley Men's Club is the promotion of Golf Events for the pleasure and recreation of our members. The following are the policies, as adopted by the Board of Directors, for conducting these events. These policies are consistent with the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of Chartered Clubs within the Recreation Centers of Sun City West. The Deer Valley Men's Golf Club is open to all Recreation Centers of Sun City West, Inc. card holders, and their accompanied guests.

WEEKLY EVENTS

Deer Valley Men's Golf Club conducts an organized sweepstake each Wednesday, playing in a morning and afternoon 'shotgun' start.

Members will automatically be entered into the weekly/monthly sweepstake when the Member requests a tee time from the Monitor. The prize fund for weekly sweepstakes is funded by a \$2.00 fee, in addition to greens fees.

A SPECIAL EVENTS Tournament will be conducted on the Second Wednesday of each month if there is no conflict with course maintenance. If a conflict exists, another Wednesday will be scheduled for that month. There will be a minimum entry fee of \$5.00 for all such events.

The Tournament Format will be determined by the Tournament Committee. Members, who have joined as Non-competitive members will not be included in any competitive events, will not pay the sweepstake fee and shall be excluded from any prizes.

All Sweepstakes fees, in addition to green fees will be paid to the Starter, on the day of play. Using the shotgun starts, players should pay their fees the first time they make the turn past the Golf Shop.

Please Sand Your Divots, Fix Your Ball Marks and Rake your Bunkers!!

CANCELLATION AND STANDBY

A cancellation and standby book will be maintained in the Golf Shop for those who must cancel and those who wish to sign up as a standby to fill in for cancellations. Cancellation entries in the book must be made by 4 PM on the Monday preceding the event. CANCELLATIONS AFTER THIS TIME MUST BE MADE WITH STARTER AT THE PRO SHOP. Any member who has not been assigned a tee time may show up ½ hour before play on Wednesday to see if the Monitor has had any late cancellations or no shows. You may also send an email anytime to the monitor at **pattidymgolf@cox.net** to cancel or signup.

CALLS TO THE MONITOR'S HOME ARE PROHIBITED

FOURSOME POUCHES

Weekly, the monitor will prepare pouches for each group containing:

- 1. Rules for any Special Event.
- 2. A copy of local rules under effect.
- 3. TEE TIME REQUEST SLIP for the next weeks play.
 - a. Tee Time Request Slips Should include each player's LAST NAME, FIRST Initial, and SCW REC CARD number. Please indicate whether AM or PM play is desired. Slips must be turned into pouch at end of play for next week.
- 4. Monitor prepared SCORECARDS
 - a. Failure to enter the following on your scorecard for all Men's Club Events will result in disqualification for the event.
 - 1. STARTING Time & FINISHING Time
 - 2. First Initial, Last Name, Recreation Card Number and Signature
 - 3. Gross Score
 - 4. Adjusted Score
 - 5. Net Score

This Policy applies to all Men's Club Events (weekly sweeps and monthly special event sweeps) unless otherwise notified on the day of an event. This Policy also applies regardless of the type of scorecard being used in any event. Members of the Tournament and Handicap Committees will audit the scorecards after each Men's Club Event for correctness and disqualify members as necessary.

SCORING

<u>ALL MUST HOLE OUT - NO GIMMIES.</u>

You must have three scores; Gross, Net, and Adjusted Score. The Gross Score is the total number of times you hit or attempt to hit the ball plus any penalty strokes. The (total) Net Score is the (total) Gross Score minus your current course handicap for the tees that you played.

The pouches are to be returned to the monitor at the end of play. A stipend of at least \$2.00 PER PLAYER, including GUESTS, should be added to the pouch EACH WEEK.

BLIND BOGEY

Before beginning play, club members may purchase, for \$1.00, a chance in the Blind Bogey pool for that week's play. The entry blank needs to include your Name, Rec#, Gross score, Handicap and Net score. After all play is completed, a number between 68 and 83 will be drawn. Players who had a NET score equal to the drawn number will equally share the pool.

Handicaps

Under the World Handicap System a player's Handicap Index is recalculated after each round posted. The Deer Valley Men's Golf Club will be using the Handicaps from the first of the month and the fifteenth of the month for weekly play. The WHS treats every score equally; the system no longer uses the Tournament Score designation. For more information on the WHS please visit www.AZGolf.org or www.AZGolf.org or www.USGA.org/WHS.



World Handicap System

The new World Handicap System went into effect on January 1, 2020. The adjustments made by ESC (Equitable Stroke Control) are no longer used. Now, for <u>handicap purposes only</u>, the maximum score allowed on any hole is <u>NET DOUBLE BOGEY</u>. Net double bogey is different for each hole based on your Course Handicap.

Net Double Bogey is the PAR of the hole, *PLUS* two strokes, *PLUS* any handicap strokes you receive on that hole.

There are Charts posted and score cards will be printed with your Course Handicap under the World Handicap System.

It is a new calculation for your Handicap Strokes that is specific for the set of tees that you play:

- Handicap Index (HI) reported from GHIN
- The Slope Rating for the set of tees you play (SR)
- Neutral Slope is 113
- The Course Rating for your set of tees (CR)

HI times (Slope Rating divided by 113) Minus (CR – Par)


- \blacktriangleright White Tees = HI x (118/113)+(68.3-72)
- \triangleright Gold Tees = HI x (112/113)+(66.6-72)
- Arr Green Tees = HI x (100/113)+(61.0-72)

This determines how many Handicap Strokes, or "POPS" that you are entitled to during Club Play. The Strokes are allocated in order of the Handicap Rating for the holes:

DVGMC Tee Policy

In order to facilitate an enjoyable golf experience for all of our golfers and to accommodate a wide variety of skill levels, the DVMGC Board has approved the use of three sets of tees for Club play. Players are encouraged to play the set of tees which most closely relates to their skill level and physical abilities which allows them to finish their round in **FOUR HOURS OR LESS**.

Groups playing longer than Four Hours will be asked to move up a set of tees.

Tee Suggestions:

- DVMGC Players with a Handicap Index of 20.9 and below are encouraged to play from the White Tees during club play. (White Tee course handicap of 18 and Gold Course handicap of 15)
- 2. DVMGC Players with a **Handicap Index of 21 to 23.9** may choose to play either the White or Gold Tees during Club Play. (White course handicap of 18-21, Gold course handicap of 15-18)
- 3. DVMGC Players with a **Handicap Index of 24 to 27.9** are encouraged to play from the Gold Tees during Club Play. (Gold Course Handicap of 18-22)
- 4. DVMGC Players with a **Handicap Index of 28 and above** may play from the Green Tees during Club Play. (Green Course Handicap of 14-31)
- 5. Only Net Winnings will be awarded on Gold or Green Tees.

Players MUST declare a tee on their next week sign-up sheet, and will not change tees. Players will have to have played a tee set for 3 weeks before using that tee set in a Club Tournament, Match or Medal Play

With the transition to the WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM on January 1, 2020; there is no longer a need to adjust handicaps when playing from different tees.



BUMPING POLICY

During our prime season, when the number of our weekly players swells to its maximum, there may arise occasions when the Monitor cannot accommodate all of the requests to play in a shotgun. On these occasions, the Monitor may be forced to 'bump' some players to the other shotgun, or have the group sitout entirely. The *intention* of the DVMGC is to randomly rotate though the shotgun groups before bumping groups a second time. The Winter 'Crush' of the DVMGC is a testament to our popularity and the desire of our fellow golfers to play with the group! The patience and understanding of our members when you are bumped is appreciated.

FROST DELAY Policy

In order to provide equity and fairness to both the AM Groups and the PM Groups, the Frost Delay Policy of the Deer Valley Men's Golf Club is as follows:

- 1. A frost delay of 1 hour or less will result in both the AM and PM groups playing 18 holes.
- 2. Frost Delays lasting MORE than One Hour:
 - a. If a Frost Delay, that is to last more than one hour, falls on an EVEN NUMBERED DATE, the AM groups will play 9 holes, and the PM groups will play 18 holes.
 - b. If a Frost Delay, that is to last more than one hour, falls on an ODD NUMBERED DATE, the AM groups will play 18 holes, and the PM groups will play 9 holes.
- 3. During the months of December and January, when starting times begin at 8:00 AM, the above applies to frost delays lasting more than 30 minutes.

All Members (AM and PM groups) will need to call the Weather Hotline 623-544-6175, (option3) to determine when their group starts, and if they will be playing either a 9 hole or 18 hole round. Please do not call the Pro-shop starters.

NINE HOLE RULES

If your group must only play nine holes and you start on the front nine, play your nine holes on the front nine only. If you start on the back nine, play your nine holes on the back nine only. For sweeps competition, record your actual nine hole gross score and compute your net score using half of your handicap. Fractional

PACE OF PLAY

Ready Golf is defined as including Pace of Play and the following is recommended.

ON THE TEES AND FAIRWAYS:

- Go directly to your ball and hit it, as long as no one is in your way and is not ready to hit.
- Cart driver Go directly to your passenger's ball and drop him off. Immediately proceed to your own ball, hit it, and return to pick up your passenger.
- Select your club while waiting to hit. Be **ready** when your turn comes. Hit a provisional ball if you think your ball is lost or out of bounds.
- 3 minute maximum search for a lost ball. The other players should hit **before** joining in the search.

ON THE GREENS:

- Putt out of turn if "away" players are not ready. Lag up if a player is off the green and is not ready.
- Continuous putting. Keep putting until you hole out, if comfortable.
- Study your line while others are putting. Be **ready** to putt.
- Proceed to the next tee immediately after holing out. Put away your clubs and enter scores at the next tee.

SCW MEDICAL FLAG AGREEMENT

SCW provides a medical flag authorization program to individuals who, due to health conditions, require additional help to comfortably complete a round of golf.

A medical flag **allows** the golfer to:

Advance the golf cart beyond the designated cart path signs and allows the golfer to drive within <u>15 feet</u> of greens and tees.

The medical flag <u>DOES NOT</u> entitle the golfer to drive into bunkers, desert areas, water hazards or casual water. Carts are NOT allowed on the fringe or apron of the green or to be driven between the greenside bunkers and the green.

Place flag in the rear of the golf cart so that it is clearly visible. Return flag to pro-shop immediately at completion of play.

PLAYER'S CODE OF CONDUCT

To maximize all Player's enjoyment of the Golf Course, and in an effort to protect the condition of the Golf Course from undue wear, the Deer Valley Men's Golf Club has established a Player's Code of Conduct.

Membership in the DVMGC is the *Member's Implied Consent* that they will play in accordance with the USGA Rules of Golf, and the DVMGC Player's Code of Conduct.

Deer Valley Men's Golf Club Players, and their guests, are expected to:

- Play by USGA Rules of Golf at all times.
- Keep carts at least 30 feet from tees and Greens;
- Keep carts out of desert areas;
- Keep carts out of the areas between the greens and curbs;
- Respect roped off areas;
- NOT drive over curbs, or curb cut-outs;
- Keep carts out of wet areas on course.
- Fill your Divots, Fix your Ball Marks, and Rake your Bunkers

As a Sun City West Chartered Club, the By-Laws and Policies of the Deer Valley Men's Golf Club provide for the Board to maintain a Code of Conduct. Our By-Laws and Rules, Regulations and Procedures provide for disciplinary action against "violations of the membership responsibilities and Code of Conduct incurred during the membership year. Transgressors shall be brought before the Board and at their discretion shall be subject to the following disciplinary actions:

- 1. First Offense- a written warning from the Club.
- 2. Second Offense- a one week suspension by the Club.
- 3. Third Offense- a two week suspension from the Club.
- 4. Fourth Offense- termination of Club membership recommended by the Recreation Center's General Manager to the Governing Board.

Any suspended or terminated Club member has the right to appeal to the Governing Board."

Procedure for Addressing Suspected Rules or Policy Infractions during DVMGC play.

Membership in the DVMGC is the *Member's Implied Consent* that they will play in accordance with the USGA Rules of Golf, and the DVMGC Player's Code of Conduct.

Golf is a game of Honor, and it **SHALL BE ASSUMED** that all Members know the Rules and are conducting their play, and that of their guests, accordingly.

In order to protect the integrity of our contests, keep our play fair to all Players, and avoid escalating misunderstandings, the following policy has been approved by the Board of the Deer Valley Men's Golf Club.

- 1. If a suspected breach of the Rules of Golf, or Code of Conduct, is witnessed, the person making the Claim, (the *Claimant*), should address the situation directly. If this is not possible, the *Claimant* shall notify a member of the Board or the Monitor, of the suspected infraction at the end of play.
- Claims not made within a reasonable amount of time after close of play, will not be considered.
- 3. The *Claimant* shall prepare a brief written description of the suspected infraction, with as much detail as possible, to identify the infraction, and the individual suspected of the breach. Forms will be available in the drawer under the DVMGC box in the Pro-Shop.
- 4. At least two Board members will review the Claim and determine its merit and severity.
- 5. If the Claim does have merit, the two Board members will attempt to discuss it, in person, with the individual(s) <u>as soon as possible in a non-confrontation manner.</u>
 - a. Example: "What can you tell us about what happened on Hole #X?"
- If the explanation shows that the Claim is without merit, the Board members will thank the individuals and drop the matter.
- 7. If the explanation shows that the **Claim does have merit**, the Board members will confer and determine which of the following steps to pursue:
 - a. The Board Members may decide to:
 - i. Drop the matter with no action.
 - ii. Confer with USGA Rules Official.
 - iii. Counsel the Player in the correct application of the Rule in question.
 - iv. Issue a verbal warning to the Player.
 - v. Have the Player forfeit any winnings resulting from the Breach.
 - vi. Issue a written warning to the Player.
 - Subsequent breaches can result in the Player being temporarily suspended from Club play.
 - viii. Chronic breaches can result in the Player being permanently suspended from Club play.
- 8. The decision of the Board Members is final.

These Local Rules are in Effect for ALL Sun City West Golf Courses

Out of Bounds: Out of bounds is defined by White Stakes and/or lines, the course edge of public roads, curbs, perimeter fences and residential boundaries. When stakes or fencing is used, the out of bounds line is determined by the nearest inside points of the stakes or fence posts at ground level.

<u>Public Roads:</u> A ball which crosses a public road defined as out of bounds and comes to rest beyond that road is out of bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course that is in bounds for another hole.

<u>Prepared Rock:</u> Areas of rock closely arranged for a functional purpose (e.g. drainage or erosion control) are deemed to be obstructions. Free relief may be taken under Rule 16.1(b).

<u>Immovable Obstruction Near the Putting Greens:</u> relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be taken under Rule 16.1. The player also has these extra options to take relief when such immovable obstructions are close to the putting green and on the line of play.

Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b if an immovable obstruction is: On the line of play, and is:

Within two club-lengths of the putting green, and

Within two club-lengths of the ball.

Exception – No Relief if Line of Play Clearly Unreasonable. There is no relief under Local Rule if the player chooses a line of play that is clearly unreasonable.

Animal Dung: At a player's option, animal dung may be treated as either a loose impediment that may be removed under Rule 15.1 or as ground under repair from which free relief is allowed under Rule 16.1.

BALL PLAYED FROM OUTSIDE RELIEF AREA WHEN TAKING BACK-ON-THE-LINE RELIEF:

(Local Rule E-12) When taking Back-on-the line relief, there is NO additional penalty if a golfer plays a ball that was dropped in the relief area required by the relevant Rule (16.2(c)(2), 17.1(d) (2), 19.2(b) or 19.3(b); but came to rest outside the relief area, so long as the ball when played, is within one club-length of where it first touched the ground when dropped. (More details available under Local Rule E-12)

Explanation

This exemption from penalty applies even if the ball is played from nearer the hole <u>than the</u> <u>reference point</u> (but not if played from nearer the hole than the spot of the original ball or the estimated point where the ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area).

This Local Rule does not change the procedure for taking Back-On-the-Line relief under a relevant Rule. This means that the reference point and relief area are not changed by this Local Rule and that <u>Rule 14.3c(2)</u> can be applied by a player who drops a ball in the right way and it comes to rest outside the relief area, whether this occurs on the first or second drop.

REPLACEMENT OF CLUB THAT IS BROKEN OR SIGNIFICANTLY DAMAGED:

Local Rule G-9) If a player's club is "broken or significantly damaged" during a round by the player or caddie, except in cases of abuse, the player may replace the club with any club under Rule 4.1b (4). When replacing a club, the player must immediately take the broken or significantly damaged club out of play, using the procedure in Rule 4.1c (1).

For this Local Rule: - A club is "broken or significantly damaged" when:

- > the shaft breaks into pieces, splinters or is bent, not only dented
- > the club face impact area is visibly deformed, not only scratched
- > the club head is visibly and significantly deformed
- > the club head is detached or loose from the shaft, or
- > the grip is loose.

Exception: A club face or club head is not "broken or significantly damaged" solely because it is cracked.

These Local Rules are in Effect for Deer Valley Men's Golf Club Play Only

Wash out areas in the sandy (desert) areas of the course are deemed to be Ground Under Repair. Free Relief under Rule 16.1.

DVMGC Local Rule during Club Play provides an Alternative to Stroke-and-Distance for a Ball that is Lost outside a Penalty Area, or is Out of Bounds. Determine where the ball went out of bounds or is likely lost. Find the nearest fairway edge **no closer to the** hole. Drop your ball, in the fairway, within two club lengths of the fairway edge. This option allows the player to drop in a large area between the point where a lost ball is estimated to have come to rest or gone out of bounds and the edge of the fairway that is not nearer the hole. The player takes two penalty strokes when using this relief option, so that the relief is comparable to what could have been achieved if the player had taken *stroke-and-distance* relief.

Occasional Local Rule:

On occasions when conditions such as **wet ground conditions** throughout parts of the course may cause mud to stick to the ball, the DVMGC **MAY announce**, **prior to the round**, that the Club play will allow a <u>MARK, LIFT, CLEAN & REPLACE</u> Local Rule to be in effect:

When a player's ball lies in the general area the ball may be lifted cleaned and replaced without penalty. The player must mark the spot before lifting the ball (see Rule 14.1) and the ball must be replaced on its original spot (see Rule 14.2).

Deer Valley Men's Golf Club Tournament Rules

In competitions run by the Deer Valley Men's Golf Club, ties are an acceptable result. However, when deemed necessary to have a sole winner, the following procedures will be used:

- a) When the players in a **MATCH PLAY** competition complete the final hole of the stipulated round all square, the match shall be extended on a hole by hole basis until one side wins a hole. The match shall continue on the hole where the match began. Relevant handicap holes still apply just as they did at the beginning of the match.
- b) In the event of a tie in a **HANDICAP STROKE COMPETITION**, matching scorecards will determine the winner on the basis of the best score for the last nine holes. If tying players have the same score for the last nine, determine the winner on the basis of the last six holes, the last three holes played and finally the 18th hole. If this method is used in a competition with a multiple tee start (1 & 10, or a shotgun) it is recommended that the last nine holes, the last six holes, etc. is considered to be 10-18, 13-18, etc. and that this be announced in advance.
- c) If a single winner is deemed necessary in a **HANDICAP STROKE COMPETITION** played on multiple courses, an 18 hole playoff will be played at Deer Valley Golf Course at the earliest convenience.

Match Play Tournament

In order to conduct a DVMGC Match Play Tournament, the Club must have a minimum of 80 member-players registered to compete. Match Play will be played for Three (3) consecutive weeks on March 6, 13, and 20, 2024. Most recent handicaps will be used for all Match Play.

- a) In Match play, you and your opponent compete against each other based on holes won, lost or tied.
- b) In a SCRATCH competition, your "Gross Score" for a hole or round is your total number of strokes. In a HANDICAP competition your "Net Score" for a hole or round is your gross score adjusted for your handicap strokes.
- c) You win a hole when you complete the hole in fewer strokes than your opponent, your opponent concedes the hole, or your opponent gets the general penalty (loss of hole). You tie a hole (also known as "halved") when you and your opponent complete the hole in the same number of strokes.
- d) You win a Match when you lead your opponent by more holes than remain to be played, your opponent concedes the match, or your opponent is disqualified.
- e) You may concede your opponent's next stroke, hole, or match; but <u>a concession is only made when it is clearly communicated</u>. A concession is Final, it cannot be withdrawn, nor can your opponent decline the concession.
 - f) Additional specific instructions may be provided to each player prior to competition.

Medal Play Club Championship

In order to be more inclusive of our members, the Rules governing our 2024 Medal Play Club Championship have been modified to accommodate our members varying levels of handicap but will require at least a two week commitment.

- In 2024, ALL members will participate in the Club Championship. (Excludes noncompeting members)
- 2. \$10 Sweeps
- 3. Eligible Play will be on 3 Wednesdays: 2/14, 2/21, 2/28
- 4. The Handicaps from 2/01 will be used for all Medal Play.
- The aggregate of the Player's BEST <u>2 Scores</u> will be used to determine the GROSS and NET Winners.
- 6. Players will be Flighted by their February 1, 2024 Handicaps.
- 7. Each Flight will have a Low Gross and a Low Net Winner.
 - 8. The <u>lowest overall GROSS aggregate score</u> will be the: "2024 DVMGC Club Medal Low Gross Champion" and represent the DVMGC in the April "Saturday Shootout".
- 9. The <u>lowest overall NET aggregate score</u> will be the:
 - "2024 DVMGC Club Medal Low Net Champion"

The Weekly Sweeps, Blind Bogey and Closest-to-Pin contests will run concurrently on both of these three week Tournaments.

Move-Up Scramble Tournament

1) Most Players will MOVE UP ONE SET OF TEES.

If you <u>normally</u> play from the White Tees, you'll play from the Gold Tees! If you <u>normally</u> play from the Gold Tees, you'll play from the Red Tees! Green Tee players will continue to use the Green Tees.

All players tee off, as normal.

- 2). ONE ball is chosen to be played next. All Players will hit from this spot.
- 3). **In the General Area**, the ball can be played within **ONE Club length** of the original ball, but staying in the same type of ground. Example: Original ball on fairway, within ONE CLUB length on the fairway; Original ball in desert, within ONE CLUB length in the desert; Original ball in bunker, within ONE CLUB length in the bunker.
- 4). **ON THE GREEN**, balls must be played **within ONE CLUBHEAD length** of the original ball's position.
- 5). Each Four-some Player's DRIVE <u>must</u> be used 4 Times during the round. Each three-some Player's DRIVE <u>must</u> be used 5 Times during the round.

Low Net Tournamant

- 1. The Tournament will be individual stroke play, with a TEAM component.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- 3. No gimme putts, each player must finish each hole
- 4. The **Team Score per hole** is the **Lowest Net Score**.
- 5. The **Team Score Overall** is the sum of the lowest net score from each hole.
- 6. Teams will be flighted by 3 or 4 players; and by the team's overall handicap.

2 Low Net Tournament

- 1. The Tournament will be individual stroke play, with a TEAM component.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- 3. No gimme putts, each player must finish each hole
- 4. The Team Score per hole is the 2 Lowest Net Scores.
- 5. The **Team Score Overall** is the sum of the two lowest net scores from each hole.
- 6. Teams will be flighted by 3 or 4 players; and by the team's overall handicap.

Red, White and Blue Tournament

- 1. The Tournament will be individual stroke play, with a TEAM component.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- 3. No gimme putts, each player must finish each hole
- 4. The TEAM Score will be calculated based on the Flag color for that hole.
 - a. Blue Flag holes will record the BEST ONE NET Score.
 - b. White Flag holes will record the <u>BEST TWO NET Scores</u>.
 - c. Red Flag Holes will record the BEST THREE NET Scores.
- 5. Teams will be flighted by 3 or 4 players; and by the team's overall handicap.

Modified Stableford Tournament

- 1. The Tournament will be individual stroke play, with a TEAM component.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- 3. No gimme putts, each player must finish each hole
- 4. Scoring is based on GROSS points per hole:

Double Eagle or Hole-in-One	6 Points
Eagle	4 Points
Birdie	3 Points
PAR	2 Points
Bogey	1 Point
Double Bogey and Higher	0 Points

- 5. Points are awarded on GROSS scores. Report the Individual's Score.
- 6. Team Scores will be the cumulative Individual Scores, PLUS the Team's Handicap.

Colorama Tournament

- 1. The Tournament will be individual stroke play, with a TEAM component.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- 3. No gimme putts, each player must finish each hole
- 4. Each Player will have a designated Color on the Official Score Card.
- 5. The Flag Sticks will have a color indicator on the bottom of the pin.
- 6. Each Player will have four holes with the color indicated.
- For holes where a Player's Color is indicated, the TEAM Score will be That Player's Net Score, PLUS the LOW NET SCORE from the other Players.
- On holes with NO COLOR indicator, the Team Score will be the TWO LOW NET scores
- 9. Teams will be flighted by 3 or 4 players; and by the team's overall handicap.

Yellow Ball Tournament

- 1. The tournament will be individual Stroke Play with a Team Component.
- The Official Scorecard will be marked to indicate which Player is to use the Official YELLOW BALL on which holes.
- 3. Each Player in the Foursome will play the YELLOW BALL on 4 designated holes during the Tournament.
- 4. On holes where a YELLOW BALL is played, the YELLOW BALLNET score, PLUS the LOW NET SCORE, from the other Players will be the Team score.
- 5. On holes without a YELLOW Ball, the Team Score will score the <u>TWO LOW NET</u> scores
- The YELLOW BALL <u>MUST</u> be returned to the Monitor after the round to qualify for prizes.

Scramble Tournament

- 1. The Tournament will be conducted on a TEAM handicap basis.
- 2. Players will play from their normal tees, NO Moving Up.
- The Best Shot is selected, the other balls are moved to that spot* and this decision repeats on each shot until the ball is holed.
- Team Score used is the GROSS SCORE, but Teams will be flighted by 3 or 4 Players; and by total combined handicaps.
- Each Four-some Player's DRIVE <u>must</u> be used 4 Times during the round.
 Each three-some Player's DRIVE <u>must</u> be used 5 Times during the round.

*IN THE GENERAL AREA, the ball can be played within ONE Club length of the original.

Original ball in the fairway within ONE CLUB length on the fairway;

Original ball in desert, within ONE CLUB length in the desert;


Original ball in bunker, within ONE CLUB length in the bunker.

*ON THE GREEN, balls must be played within ONE CLUBHEAD length of the Original ball's position.



Shamble Tournament

- 1. A **SHAMBLE** is a type of golf tournament that combines elements of a <u>Scramble</u> with elements of regular handicapped Individual Stroke Play.
- 2. All Players tee off from their normal tees, No Moving Up.
- 3. As in a Scramble, The Best Shot is selected, the other balls are moved to that spot*, then its Individual Stroke Play until each member of the group has holed out. This repeats on each hole.
- 4. Please note for the **SECOND** shot only:
- 5. *In the General Area, the ball can be played within ONE Club length of the selected ball, no closer to the hole, but staying in the same type of ground. Example: Original ball on fairway, within ONE CLUB length on the fairway; Original ball in desert, within ONE CLUB length in the desert; Original ball in bunker, within ONE CLUB length in the bunker. From this point, the hole is played out at stroke play, with all members of the team playing their own ball into the hole.
- 6. *ON THE GREEN, balls must be played within ONE CLUBHEAD length of the original ball's position, no closer to the hole.
- 7. Once the Players ball is "In Play" after the SECOND shot, regular USGA Rules of Individual Stroke Play are in effect.
- 8. Four-some Player's <u>must</u> use 4 Drives during the round. Three-some Player's <u>must</u> use 5 Drives during the round
- 9. Scorecards will indicate holes with handicap strokes.
- 10. The **Lowest Two Net Scores** on each hole will be recorded as the TEAM SCORE.
